In order to facilitate promotion and development of Micro and Small Enterprises and in exercise of the power conferred in Section 11 of the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006 of Government of India and also in conjunction with Odisha MSME Development Policy, 2009, Government of Odisha in MSME Department have been pleased to declare "Odisha Procurement Preference Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises" emphasizing on the mandatory procurement preference so as to broaden the marketing avenues for Micro & Small Enterprises of the State.

"Odisha Procurement Preference Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises" shall rest upon core principles of competitiveness, adhering to sound procurement practices and execution of orders for supply of quality goods or services in fair, transparent, rationally equitable and cost effective manner.

This has been approved by the State Cabinet in their 14<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on the 30<sup>th</sup> May 2015 as communicated by the Parliamentary Affairs Department in their Memo No.2528, dated the 30<sup>th</sup> May 2015. A copy of the "Odisha Procurement Preference Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises" is enclosed for wide publication.

## ODISHA PROCUREMENT PREFERENCE POLICY FOR MICRO & SMALL ENTERPRISES, 2015

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### 1. Introduction

The State of Odisha has witnessed an impressive growth of economy in recent past years despite global economy slow-down. Perceptible economy growth is being achieved from the significant contribution of Service & Manufacturing Sectors to the Gross State Domestic Production. Besides, abundance of Iron & Mineral resources has invited sizable corporate investment proposal into the State. Successive policy frameworks with pragmatic approach have served as pillars of economic, infrastructure & social development and created employment prospect in the State.

The extant Policies have provisions to promote procurement of goods and services by State Government Departments and agencies under its control from local Micro & Small Enterprises via Rate Contract, purchase from Exclusive list and purchase by open Tender with price preference. Despite of efforts & initiatives taken, the Micro & Small Enterprises of the State suffer with the inherent weakness in the area of marketing. The critical concern is that the Micro & Small Enterprises have specific needs & requirements such as mandatory procurement preferences, price preferences, participation in high value procurement and composite tenders, timely payment etc. to the possible extent consistent with economy and efficiencies.

Government of India has enacted MSME Development Act, 2006 for facilitating the promotion and development and enhancing the competitiveness of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises where there is provision to notify Procurement Preference Policy in respect of procurement of goods and services, produced and provided by Micro & Small Enterprises.

In consonance with the provisions of said Act, Government of India has announced Public Procurement Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 with an objective that Central Government Ministries, Departments and Public Sector Undertakings shall procure minimum of twenty



per cent of their annual value of goods or services from Micro & Small Enterprises.

Besides, MSME Development Act, 2006 has conferred the power that the State Government may, by notification, make rules to carry out the provisions of MSME Development Act, 2006.

In order to ensure the implementation of provisions of MSME Development Act, 2006 of Government of India, extant Policies of the State and to address the typical needs & requirements to support the marketing in a focused manner and to accelerate the pace of growth of Micro & Small Enterprise Sector of the State by enhancing competitiveness, it is the endeavour of the State Government to make an effort to declare a robust policy framework christened as "ODISHA PROCUREMENT PREFERENCE POLICY FOR MICRO & SMALL ENTERPRISES, 2015" emphasizing on the mandatory procurement preference to broaden the marketing avenues.

2. Short Title & Extent

The Policy is christened as "Odisha Procurement Preference Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises, 2015" and extended to the whole of the State of Odisha.

3. Effective Date

It shall come into force with effect from its Notification.

4. Objectives

- 4.1 To provide and ensure fair, transparent, consistent, rationally equitable procurement practices of goods & services, produced and provided by Micro & Small Enterprises enhancing their competitiveness.
- 4.2 To make certain that State Government Departments and Agencies under its control shall procure minimum of twenty per cent (20%) of their annual value goods or services from local Micro & Small Enterprises.
- 4.3 Central Public Sector Undertakings, MoU signed projects in the State, Power Generation Companies & Power Distribution Companies, Union Government / State Government aided projects / externally aided projects funded by donor agencies shall also procure minimum of twenty



per cent (20%) of their annual value goods or services from local Micro & Small Enterprises.

## 5. Strategy

The crux of any well-meaning Policy lies in its effective implementation with appropriate measures keeping in view the practical difficulties. The strategy Components necessitate-

- 5.1 Coordination among State Government Department & Agencies,
- 5.2 Involvement of stake holders,
- 5.3 Emphasizing on quality production of goods and service provided
- 5.4 Enhancing competitiveness with cost reduction,
- 5.5 Emphasis on timely action.

## 6. Applicability

Odisha Procurement Preference Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises, **2015** shall apply to -

- 6.1 Micro and Small Enterprises of the State acknowledged with Permanent Registration Certificate / Entrepreneurship Memorandum Part-II by Regional Industries Centre / District Industries Centre or registered with Khadi and Village Industries Commission or Odisha Khadi and Village Industries Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Director of Handicraft & Cottage Industries, Director of Textile or any other body specified by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India.
- 6.2 Micro and Small Enterprises of the State covered under Public Procurement Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 of Government of India.

Provided further that Micro and Small Enterprises as stated above in Para 6.1 to 6.2 fulfill the following criteria -

- I. Not declared ineligible under the extant Policies and under any new policy announced by the State,
- II. The eligible Micro / Small Enterprise shall have sizable presence in the open market including exports in the preceding financial year. It may

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not be applicable to the new Micro and Small Enterprises started production in the year of its' supply of goods / services under this Policy,

III. The quality of goods and services produced and provided by Micro & Small Enterprises is sufficiently good for the purpose.

6.3 State Government Departments and Agencies under its control means -

6.3.1 Explanation- I: Departments under the Odisha Government Rules of Business, Heads of Department and offices subordinate to them, Boards, Corporations, Development Authorities and Improvement Trusts, Municipalities, Notified Area Councils, Co-operative Bodies and Institutions aided by the State Government and Companies where Government share is 50% or more.

6.3.2 Explanation- II: In order to give effect to the provisions of the paragraph- 6.3.1 as above, required incorporation shall be made in the Odisha General Financial Rules (Appendix-6, Rule 96) and the Finance Department will issue required Notification to this effect.

6.3.3 Explanation - III: The procurement under this Policy shall not apply for purchases where there are separate procurement guidelines prescribed by State / National Department & Ministries / international funding agencies.

## 7. Nodal Agency

7.1 Director of Export Promotion & Marketing will be the Nodal Agency for implementation of the provisions of this Policy and issue of detailed guidelines thereof.

7.2 Director, Export Promotion & Marketing or his nominee will be a member of the purchase committee constituted at levels above the District level and General Manager, RIC / DIC or his representative will be a member of purchase committee constituted at District level or below in State Government Departments and Agencies under the control of State Government & other agencies as explained at Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy.



- 7.3 Director, EP&M or his representative shall have authority by Notification to access to tender papers, purchase documents etc. to ascertain whether there has been any contravention in the implementation of the policy.
  - 7.4 Director, EP&M will have the power to draw samples and test the quality of products of local Micro & Small Enterprises time to time and shall have powers to black list and de-register industries & recommend to the concerned quarters for de-registration / cancellation of related registration certificate / EM-Part-II etc for supplying products not conforming to prescribed quality and specifications. He shall have the power to black list local industries for trading in the store item instead of manufacturing.
  - 7.5 Director, Export Promotion & Marketing shall have authority by Notification for resolution of grievance / dispute of Micro & Small Enterprises and making recommendation to appropriate authority /Grievance Cell / Review Committee for consideration and redressal of grievances in respect of procurement preference.
- 8. Setting up of Grievance Cell**
- 8.1 A Grievance Cell shall be set up in Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Department by Notification for redressing grievances of Micro and Small Enterprises in respect of procurement preference. Related issues raised by Micro and Small Enterprises shall be taken up with Government Departments or agencies concerned including imposition of unreasonable conditions in tenders floated by State Government Departments and Agencies under the control of State Government & other agencies as explained at Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy that may put Micro & Small Enterprises at a disadvantage.
- 9. Review Committee**
- a. A Review Committee headed by Secretary, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Department shall be constituted by Notification with Members

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from line Departments under this Policy for monitoring of implementation, evaluation and mid - course - correction, wherever necessary.

9.1 This Committee shall, inter alia, review list of items reserved for exclusive purchase from Micro and Small enterprises, consider request of Government Departments and Agencies under the control of State Government & other agencies as explained at Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy for exemption from 20 per cent target on a case to case basis and monitor achievements under the policy.

9.2 Enforcement Mechanism- The Review Committee shall enforce the implementation of Mandatory Procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises to achieve overall procurement goal of minimum of 20 per cent.

#### 10. Mandatory Procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises

10.1 State Government Departments and Agencies & other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy shall set an annual goal of procurement of products produced and services rendered by Micro and Small Enterprises **as enlisted in the Appendix** so as to achieve procurement of minimum twenty per cent (20%) of the value of their requirement from local Micro & Small Enterprises within a period of three years from the year of notification of this Policy.

10.2 Annual goal of procurement also include sub-contracts to Micro and Small Enterprises by large enterprises and consortia of Micro and Small Enterprises formed by Odisha Small Industries Corporation / National Small Industries Corporation.

10.3 After a period of three years, overall procurement goal of minimum of 20 per cent shall be made mandatory.

10.4 The State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy which fail to meet the annual goal shall substantiate with reasons to the Review Committee constituted under this Policy.

10.5 The existing Policy provisions like price preference, Rate contract, Exclusive list, exemption from payment of earnest money, subsidized



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security deposit etc for extending marketing support to eligible Micro & Small enterprises shall have continuance until substituted by any means.

10.6 In tenders, participating Micro and Small Enterprises must be registered under Odisha VAT and or CST Act **and must have VAT clearance Certificate in form 612-A as prescribed under Section -99 of Odisha Value Added Tax Act,2004** . Evaluation of tender papers of Micro and Small Enterprises shall be made on the basic price including price preferences & other charges but excluding VAT, taxes etc as per the provisions notified by Finance Department, Government of Odisha from time to time.

10.7 Inspection of supplying Micro & Small Enterprises may be conducted jointly by the procuring Department / Agencies, Director, EP&M and OSIC Ltd, wherever necessary.

**11.** Special provisions for Micro and Small Enterprises owned by Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged, Women and Technical (Degree / Diploma holding) Out of 20 percent target of annual procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises, a sub-target of 20 percent (i.e., 4 percent out of 20 percent) shall be earmarked for procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises owned by the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged, Women and Technical (Degree / Diploma holding) entrepreneurs. Provided that, in event of failure of such Micro and Small Enterprises to participate in tender process or meet tender requirements and L1 price, 4 percent sub-target earmarked for procurement shall be met from other Micro and Small Enterprises of the State.

**12. Reporting of Target and Achievements**

12.1 The data on target set with respect to procurements and achievement made thereto from local Micro and Small Enterprises shall be made available in the website of State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy on annual basis.

12.2 The annual reporting shall facilitate in better understanding of support being provided by State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy to Micro and Small Enterprises of the State.

**13. Developing Micro and Small Enterprise vendors.**

13.1 The Nodal Agency in association with the State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy shall take necessary steps to develop appropriate vendors by organizing Vendor Development Programmes or Buyer-Seller Meets and entering into Rate Contract with Micro and Small Enterprises for a specified period in respect of periodic requirements.

13.2 Special Vendor Development Programmes or Buyer-Seller Meets shall be conducted by OSIC Ltd in consultation with the State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy for procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises owned by the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged, Women and Technical (Degree / Diploma holding) entrepreneurs.

13.3 OSIC Ltd shall play pivot role in consortia formation from the Micro and Small Enterprises owned by the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged, Women and Technical (Degree / Diploma holding) personnel as well as general entrepreneurs.

13.4 The State Government Departments and Agencies under its control shall adopt e-procurement to bring in transparency in tender process.

13.5 There should not be any minimum turnover requirement for Micro and Small Enterprises in participating in procurement process under this policy.

**14. Annual Plan for Procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises on websites**



State Government Departments and Agencies under its control and other agencies as in Para 4.2 & 4.3 of this Policy shall prepare Annual Procurement Plan for purchase and upload the same on their official website so that Micro and Small Enterprises may get advance information about requirement of procurement agencies.

**15. Reduction in Transaction cost**

To reduce transaction cost of doing business, Micro and Small Enterprises shall be facilitated by providing them the fiscal incentives enunciated in the extant policies of the State Government such as price preference including additional price preference, **exemption from payment of earnest money** and payment of 25 per cent of prescribed security deposit, adopting e-procurement to bring in transparency in tendering process and setting up a Grievance cell in MSME Department.

**16. Sanction of Departure**

The Administrative Departments may sanction departure from the scheme in particular cases, where such departure is in the interest of the State. Application for sanction in such cases may be made to the Administrative Department concern who may issue the Order / Notification in consultation with Finance Department.

**17. Removal of Difficulty**

Any difficulties experienced during the course of implementation of this Policy and doubts / clarification relating to interpretation of any term shall be referred to and clarified by MSME Department. The decision of the Government in MSME Department in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.

**18. Miscellaneous**

18.1 This Policy shall remain in force until substituted by another Policy.

The State Government may at any time amend any provision of this policy.

18.2 Implementation of this policy will be subject to issue of Operational Guidelines / statutory Notifications, wherever necessary.

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**Ordered** that the Resolution be published in the Odisha Gazette and copies thereof be forwarded to all Departments of Government, all Heads of Department and Account General, Odisha.
